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

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Your Library in 2018/2019 (borrowed from the Duluth Library Foundation annual reports, gathered from the Duluth Public Library annual report and staff):

**927,330** visits to the library, in person and online

**27,716** people attended 803 free programs

**81,685** the number of times the library's public computers were used for research, to look for jobs or housing, to access email, to play games, and much more

**868,740** items were checked out or downloaded

**41,580** card holders

**4,394** hours were donated by 132 volunteers who orchestrated book sales, assisted with library programs, provided materials for people who are homebound, delivered books requested by local inmates, and more

In June we presented the Duluth Public Library a check for \$15,000 from the Friends. The staff, though unable to provide services to the public in the building, have been very creative in finding new ways of serving the community. Programs, storytime and trivia contests for teens and adults are offered online, a monthly book club happens on Zoom. Materials are available via curbside pickup. "Curbside crafts" take-and-make projects for kids are also available. Summer reading took place. Some of the funds were used to purchase prizes for summer reading, supplies for craft projects, giveaway books, PR materials to help promote services. There was increased spending on downloadable e-books and audiobooks.

Thank you for helping the Friends of the Duluth Public Library support the Library and its many ways of serving our community.

As we've all gotten more used to the many changes that the past several months have brought, I hope you've been able to discover and make use of the new services that the library is offering.

Curbside pickup at the Main Library began last April and continues to be a popular option for borrowing materials. If you haven't used curbside yet I'd encourage you to give it a try. All you need to do is log into your library account and place a hold on the items you want to pick up. Once you are notified that the items are ready, stop by the Main Library and let us know you're here by texting or walking up to the table. We'll gather your items, check them out, and deliver them outside. It's easy, convenient, and contactless.

Returns are being accepted 24 hours a day, seven days a week at the Main Library. If you're still hanging on to those books that you checked out last February, we'd love to have them back so we can make them available to others in the community.

Computers and internet access have become even more crucial these days as so many services have moved online. In October we opened up the Computer Center at the Main Library for one-hour appointments.

If you're looking for a fun, socially distanced activity for your family, check out our GooseChase scavenger hunts. All you need is a smartphone, the Goosechase app, and a sense of fun and adventure.
